Jazz Great for New York Shows

amaican-born jazz pianist Monty Alexander is set to thrill fans in the Big Apple early next month with music from his new album, "Concrete Jungle: The Music of Bob Marley." Alexander is slated for live performances at the Jazz Standard, 116 East 27th St. in Manhattan, from Aug. 9 through Aug. 13 at 7:30 and 9: 30 p.m. nightly.

Alexander debuted professionally as a musician in the late 1950's along with his group, "The Cyclones." They landed several songs on the Jamaican music charts between 1958 and 1960. Alexander moved to the U.S. in 1961 and has enjoyed a stellar career since.
